## Young Inventors Journal (YIJ) 2021 Video Category - Terms and Conditions

### Young Inventors Journal (YIJ) Video Category

1. **For Malaysian school participants: this competition is not endorsed by Ministry of Education (MOE) Malaysia – So, the co-curriculum points is as per your school's discretion. Please consult your Teacher/Headmaster on this matter.**
2. By participating in YIJ Video Category either you or your team will automatically accept these terms and conditions.
3. **Young Inventors Journal (YIJ) Video Category** is open to participants aged 17 years old and below.
4. Age of participant is counted based on the age of participant on the year 2021.
5. There is no fee for participating in this competition.
6. Individual or a team of no more than 5 people can participate.
7. The age category will be determined by the oldest person in the video; e.g. if there are 2 person in the video one aged 10 and another aged 16, then the team will be eligible for video category, even if there is another person in the team aged 50 but does not appear in the video.
8. Your video should be in English.
9. Please Name your video as **YIJ2021\_Individual or Team Name**. The video must be between 3 to 7 minutes in duration. Some ideas on the chronology of the video can be:
  - Who You Are? Introduction to Your Team (compulsory)
  - Introduction - why your subject is important and what others have done? (compulsory)
  - Objectives - what you hope to achieve with the video in very specific terms (compulsory)
  - Methodology/Discussion – Depending on the type of video (See the various training modules) or ask the organiser if in doubt
  - Conclusion - Overall Summary of your videos and next steps etc. (compulsory)
  - Acknowledgement
  - Reference (which must be stated in your description section of YouTube or emailed to us separately).
10. You may use visual aids and other supplementary videos but be mindful of Intellectual Property (IP) infringements.
11. The video is to be uploaded in your own YouTube channel and the link should be sent to ASTI as per instructions.
12. When you are uploading your video into YouTube, we advise you to make your video **unlisted** in the visibility section so that only the people with the link can view your video. This will help ensure that your ideas are private until the judging process is complete.
13. You are responsible for the cost (if any) of creating your YIJ entry, as well as all other costs associated with participation in the competition.
14. A participant may not submit more than 3 videos as an individual or as part of a group.
15. **You own the copyright to your competition entry as its author but ASTI reserves the right to disclose it in its publications, broadcasts, productions, educational and marketing materials.**
16. The organizer reserves the right to merge categories (paper writing and video categories) if there are insufficient participation in the said category or any other reason.
17. All Participants that meet YIJ criteria set will receive a digital certificate.

18. Individuals / teams selected **may be** required to attend the presentation/viva online expected to be held in early January 2022, probably on a Saturday. Final dates will be confirmed in due time.
19. ASTI reserves the right to modify the terms and condition in the interest of fair play, inclusivity, and appeal from participants/stakeholders etc. The participants will be informed if there are any such changes.
20. A total of 2 mentor(s) can be appointed by the team and can be anyone of any age for the participants
21. YIJ will acknowledge the mentor(s) with a certificate

### **Picking the Best Entries**

---

1. A panel of independent judges will choose the best entries from all the valid submissions. For your information, the marking for YIJ is usually done by a minimum of 2 judges however if their marks are highly differential, an independent judge will review it to mediate.
2. When choosing the best entries, the judges will be looking for entrants who are clearly on top of their subject, who can explain what is important in a very short time, who can deliver with verve and passion, the novelty of the presentation, and who leave the viewer wanting to learn more about the subject.
3. **YIJ 2021** judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entertained.
4. Please also respect copyright of other people when producing your video.
